THE WOOL SITUATION.

The Oregonian says editorially: "The 1902 wool clip of Oregon promises to be a record breaker, and the quality of the product is above the average of recent years."

The Oregonian has always been an enemy of the tariff on wool—in fact has always maintained that the tariff as a whole was a bad thing for the American workman.

A very bad thing, indeed! Still, our woolgrower is satisfied, notwithstanding the Oregonian tries to make him dissatisfied. The Oregonian's theory on the wool proposition should not be taken seriously.

Still, the market in Lake county opened last week at 12 3/4 and went to 13 3/4.

At the late election Harney county was carried by the Republicans for the first time since its organization. Harney has always been Democratic on state issues by 50 to 100.

A hard fight is being waged against Governor Gage of California to keep him out of the nomination for a second term. It looks now like E. B. Edson, present railroad commissioner, and a Northern California man, might be the Republican nominee.

The total vote cast for Governor in Oregon was 79,468, and Mr. Chamberlain received a majority of 256, according to the official count.
