

The Hospital for a Criminal.

"Butcher Bill," (Wm. Nagle) a well known character of Alturas, is a man in the toils for selling liquor to Indians. Bill was caught redhanded in the act, and when brought before the court he was allowed to plead guilty to misdemeanor. Strange to say the miscreant will be held in jail for a few days and then turned over to the steward of Modoc's county hospital instead of the warden of the penitentiary. The Plaindealer in this connection says:

"Thus by rare good fortune, Bill, instead of passing six months in the penitentiary, will spend the balance of his days in the hospital—instead of living for a short time at the expense of the State, will become a permanent charge upon the people of Modoc county—a life pension for committing a crime. Besides, as we view the matter, being a mistaken leniency, it offers a poor inducement for our officers to spend days and nights in apprehending criminals. Another thing: Such procedure encourages others to continue the vile traffic, robbing these poor people (the Indians) of hard earned money that should go to their families."

The liquor traffic continues to be carried on among the Indians and some lawbreaker or lawbreakers in Lakeview. There appears to be no way to get evidence against the parties who furnish the Indians with liquor, however. It looks easy, though, if the proper authorities would do a little detective work.

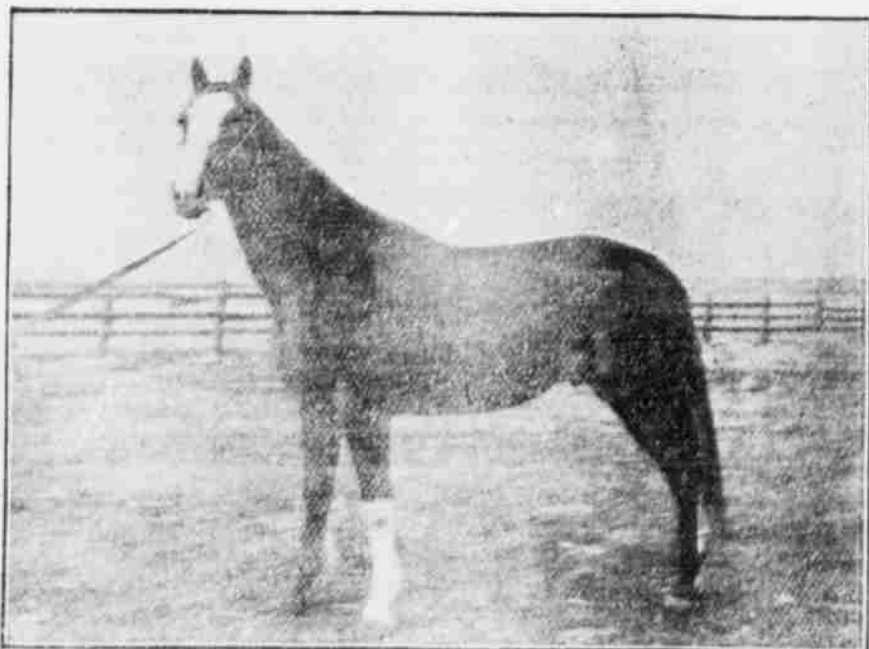

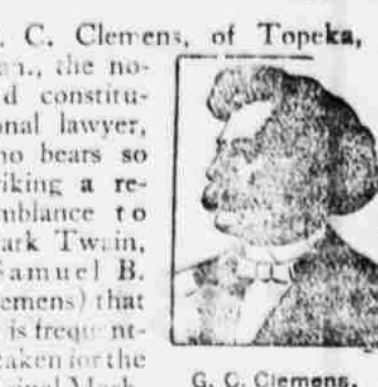
