Wide Tires and Good Roads.

Doubtless the best way to keep an earth road, or any road, for that mat ter, in repair is by the use of wide fires on all wagons earrying heavy burdens. Water and narrow tires aid each other in destroying streets, mac adam, gravel and earth roads. Nar row tires are also among the most destructive agents to the fields, pastures and meadows of farms, while, on the other hand, wide tires are roadmakers, They coll and harden the surface, and every loaded wagon becomes in effect a road roller. Nothing so much tends to the improving of a road as the confinued rolling of its surface. Tests made at the experiment stations in tages to shippers to car loads. Utah and Missouri show that wide tires. not only improve the surface of reads, which induces storage, insurance and hand-but that under ordinary circumstances ling one year, if desired. less power is required to pull a wagon so which with tires are stard.


