

SAID HE WAS TRACY AND--

Came Near Getting Killed by a Brother of the Deputy Sheriff Tracy Shot Down.

William Nixon, of the disorderly district of Seattle, tried to win a woman's affection in the guise of outlaw Tracy, and is nearly dead as the result of his foolhardy act. He told an actress in a music hall that he was no other than the famous desperado, and threatened her life if she told. He made her buy him drinks and promise to supply him with money. Saturday night when he entered the theater building, he was attacked by a policeman, and the proprietor, Joe Williams, a brother of Deputy Sheriff Jack Williams, who was wounded in a battle with Tracy at Bothell, July 3. He was pounded into insensibility, and has not fully regained his faculties yet. The mistake was discovered when the man's features were compared to those of a photograph at police headquarters. It is almost a miracle that the policeman did not shoot first and investigate afterwards, as he was told positively that the man was Tracy and a reward of nearly \$7000 is offered for the desperado, dead or alive.
