Here we are, within 70 miles of a railroad, and equi ped with mills for making the best of flour, and from this part of the world not a bushel of wheat or other grain is exported; but on the contrary better prices prevail constantly for grains than on the railroad lines. Wheat is worth 60c and more the year round, and flour is continually imported from the outside. This condition is very likely to be a permanent one, for the reason that as the area in wheat increases, the city here will increase also, creating a demand that will steadily keep up with the supply.
