Eclipse of the Moon.

Few people were aware that a total eclipse of the moon was to occur on Thursday and Friday evenings, October 16 and 17, until total darkness came on. The circumstances of the eclipse were as follows, the dates being given in Eastern standard time: Moon entered penumbra October 16, 10:17 p. m.; moon entered shadow October 16, 10:17 p. m.; total eclipse October 17, 12:18 a. m. Total eclipse ended October 17, 1:48 a. m. Moon left shadow October 17, 2:59 a. m. Moon left penumbra October 17, 3:50 a. m. Lakeview people declare there was a total eclipse at 9:30 p. m. on the 16th.
