

ALP LAW IS FAVORED

Representative Emmitt Says The Law is What we Need—Also Favors Carey Irrigation.

Robert A. Emmitt, of Klamath county, Joint Representative from Klamath, Crook, Lake and Wasco counties, was in Ashland, Jan. 12 en route to Salem to attend the session of the Legislature.

Emmitt said: "Our people in the Lake country, want the bounty law to remain as it is. They are practically unanimous on that subject in Klamath, Lake Crook. As to Wasco, I do not know what the sentiment is, but my immediate constituency is decidedly opposed to a repeal of the law. Our growers desire the enactment of a law forbidding the herding of sheep within two miles of a dwelling, and petitions for such a law are being circulated. The object is to prevent sheepmen from herding their sheep about settlers' ranches. Sheepmen regard the proposition as an indirect method to deprive them of range privileges. They oppose it, of course, and point out how the sheepmen would erect houses at the watering points and, armed with a law, would be able to appropriate practically all the grazing lands to themselves.

Our section of country is particularly interested in irrigation. I favor the Carey law and will support such measures as will facilitate its operation, for the reason that there are many small irrigation propositions in my section of the state which can only be reached under the Carey act. The Government will only undertake very large irrigation enterprises, and we cannot hope that it will do anything directly for us, but under the Carey act, a great amount of land can be reclaimed. Irrigation has already contributed to wonderful progress in Klamath county. The country is settling up. Klamath Falls has had a great growth during the past year; so has Lakeview, where I was a few days ago. The little Klamath irrigation ditch has converted the desert about Merrill into as pretty alfalfa fields as were ever seen, and the country is growing rich. By the way, Merrill wants to be incorporated, or rather, the majority of the citizens desire incorporation, claiming they can better control the lawless element which has given them some trouble. They are having a row over the question of incorporation. The biggest taxpayer, who laid out the town on his land, and still owns many lots, is the principal opponent of incorporation."

Mr. Emmitt favors the Lewis and Clark Exposition, and says the appropriation ought to be liberal enough to assure success. He is inclined to support a \$500,000 appropriation.

Asked as to his attitude toward the proposal to hold a caucus of Republicans to select a United States Senator, he said: "Well now, I don't want to be quoted as to my choice for Senator. I don't know yet about a caucus. Some of those fellows who did not like a caucus two years ago now favor one. I am not committed to a caucus, nor to anybody for Senator. As to the Mays law, I notice politicians are in favor of the observance of a law, when it comes their way; otherwise they have no use for it. I am going to await developments at Salem before I decide what to do."

"Do you favor a mining bureau with an inspector or of mines?" he was asked.

"Well, now, that would be a desirable thing for the state, most likely; but do you think a Republican Legislature is going to make new places for a Democratic Governor to fill? I think not. The Legislature will recognize that there is a Democratic

Governor, and it will make a difference as to several things."

"How about additional laws for protection against forest fires?"

"We don't want any unless it is desired to provide some jobs. It would be better, if the forests were burned over every year. The grass grows better and the big trees are not injured; indeed, the timber generally will grow larger. To provide rangers or fire patrols to ride through the forests is useless."

Mr. Emmitt says stock is looking well in the Klamath country.
