esentative Emmitt Says The w is What we Need---Also Favors Carey Irrigation.

bert A. Emmitt, of Klamath ty, Joint Representative from nath, Crook, Lake and Wasco ties, was in Ashland, Jan. 12 en to Salem to attend the session Lagislature.

Emmitt sald: "Our people in the Lake country, want the bounty law to remain as it is, are practically unamimous on hat subject in Klamath, Lake Crook. As to Wasco, I do not what the sentiment is, but my ediate constituency is decidedly sed to a repeal of the law. Our legrowers desire the enactment law forbidding the herding of p within two miles of a dwellinge, and petitions for such a law being circulated. The object is prevent sheepmen from herding r sheep about settlers' ranches. epmen regard the proposition as indirect method to deprive them ange privileges. They oppose it, course, and point out how the tlemen would errect houses at the tering points and, armed with h a law, would be able to approate practically all the grazing ds to themselves.

Our section of country is particarly interested in irrigation. I or the Carey law and will support ch measures as will facilitate its eration, for the reason that there many small irrigation proposions in my section of the state nich can only be reached under the rev act. The Government will dy undertake very large irrigation terprises, and we cannot hope that will do anything directly for us, it under the Carey act, a great mount of land can be reclaimed. rigation has already contributed wonderful progress in Klamath ounty. The country is settling up. lamath Falls has had a great rowth during the past year; so has akeview, where I was a few days The little Klamath irrigation seen, and the country is rowing rich. By the way, Merrill vants to be incorported, or rather, of my wife, I am compelled to change to majority of the citizens desire inrporation, claiming they can better s given them some trouble. Mr. Emmitt favors the Lewis and lark Exposition, and says the aprepriation ought to bellberal enough o assure success. He is inclined to apport a \$500,000 appropriation.

Asked as to his attitude toward he proposal to hold a caucus of Republicans to select a United States enator, he said. "Well now, I don't want to be quoted as to my choice or Senator. I don't know yet about caucus. Some of those tellows vho did not like a caucus two years go now favor one. I am not comultted to a caucus, nor to anybody or Senator. As to the Mays law, I notice politicans are infavor of the diservation of a law, when it comes their way; otherwise they have no me forit. I am goingto await developments at Salem before I decide what to do."

"Do you favor a mining bureau with an inspect or of mines?" he was naked.

"Well, now, that would be a desirable thing for the state, most likely; but do you think a Republican Legislature is going to make new places for a Democratic Governor to fill? 1 think not. The Legislature will recognize that there is a Democratic Governor, and it will make a difference as to several things."

"Row about additional laws for protection against forest fires?"

"We don't want any unless it is desired to provide some jobs. It would be better, if the forests were burned over every year. The grass grows better and the big trees are not injured; indeed, the timber generally will grow larger. To provide rangers or fire patrols to ride through the forests is useless."

Mr. Emmitt says stock is looking well in the Klamath country.

C. McKune, Mr. Reed's brother-inlaw, arrived here Sunday night on his way to the camp, where he will receive the sheep and make the count.


