St. Louis Fair.

The St. Louis World's Fair will be approximately twice as big as any former international exposition. The Centennial Exposition at Philadelphia covered 236 acres, the Paris Exposition of 1889-1900, 336 acres, the Columbian Exposition at Chicago 633 acres, the Pan-American at Buffalo 350 acres. The St. Louis World's Fair will cover 1200 acres. The construction cost of the Paris Exposition was \$9,000,000, that of the Columbian Exposition \$18,322,000 and the total cost of the Pan-American Exposition was \$10,000,000. The estimated cost of the St. Louis World's Fair will be \$30,000,000. This will mean \$40,000,000 by the time the work is completed. Before the Exposition gates are open, the city of St. Louis will have expended the enormous sum of \$20,000,000. Of this amount \$5,000,000 was appropriated for the Fair though the Municipal Assembly, her citizens raised \$5,000,000 additional by private subscription, and by popular vote at a special election the Charter Amendments were carried, will enable the city to expend \$10,000,000 for street paving and other public improvements.
