

## COUNTY COURT

Lakeview, Oregon, March 4th 1903.

A regular term of the County Court of the State of Oregon, for the County of Lake, met at the Court House in Lakeview, Lake County, Oregon, for the transaction of County business, on the 4th day of March 1903, at 10 o'clock a.m. at which were present, Hon. B. Daly, Judge, S. J. Prose and W. A. Currier Commissioners, H. R. Dunlap, Sheriff, and A. W. Mauring, Clerk, when the following proceedings were had:

The Court examined the Sheriffs books and found the same to be correct.

Court adjourned until tomorrow, March 5th.

Court convened pursuant to adjournment of March 4th, the same officers being present, when the following proceedings were had, to wit:

## TO THE ROAD SUPERVISORS OF LAKE COUNTY, OREGON.

The law requires that each road supervisor shall report to the county court, at such times as the court may direct. Such report should state how much money has been collected, by whom collected and if expended, to whom paid, and also the purpose for which the same was paid, and all other information, pertaining to the roads, culverts and bridges in his district, so that the county court shall have exact and specific knowledge, of not only the roads, but of every culvert and bridge in the county.

Each road supervisor should make a careful inspection of every bridge and culvert in his district, during the month of April in each year, and make an estimate of the amount of lumber necessary to repair the same. A report of such inspection should be filed with the county court at the May term, so that the report may be examined, and authority given to purchase the lumber required, to make such repairs.

Often serviceable lumber, when repairing culverts and bridges, is thrown away and replaced by new lumber, which should not be done, as it is a waste of public money. The county court would, therefore, urge that strict economy be used in the repair of all culverts and bridges in each district.

Usually the spring floods, cause great damage to the county roads; each road supervisor should therefore inspect the roads in his district during such floods, and prevent so far as possible, the roads from being washed away.

Under the law, no road supervisor has any authority, to create any indebtedness against the county, except in case of an emergency, without an order of the county court.

As a presumption of law, all culverts crossing any public road for the purpose of diverting water for private use, shall be, until the contrary is shown, held to have been made after said road became a public highway, and every such culvert shall be kept in repair by the person or persons using the same.

The following requirements of law, governing the duties of road supervisors, are hereby called to the attention of the road supervisors of Lake County.

Section, 4834. Duty of Road Supervisors in Respect to Road Work.

The supervisor must notify every person within his district subject to road labor—to perform the work assessed on the public roads within his district; and if any person subject to road labor as aforesaid, shall after three days notice, either personally or by writing left at his usual place of abode, by the supervisor or by any other person by his direction, neglect or refuse to attend by himself or suitable substitute at the time and place designated by the supervisor, or having attended shall refuse to obey the directions of the supervisor, or pass his time in idleness or inattention to the labors or duties assigned him, every such delinquent shall thereby become liable to the supervisor for the amount of his road tax in money; and such supervisor shall proceed at once to collect the same by levy and sale of the property, real and personal, of such delinquent, or sufficient thereof for that purpose and to pay the penalty for such delinquency and the costs and expense of the levy and sale.

Section, 4826. Persons Liable to Road Work.

Each road supervisor shall assess two days work to be performed by each male between twenty-one and fifty years of age who reside in his district, except persons who are a public charge or too infirm to perform labor.

Section, 4844. Account of Work to be Kept.

Every road supervisor shall keep an account of the days work performed on the roads in payment of road tax, and by whom performed and also an account of all money collected or received by him for road tax, and of the expenditure of the same or any part thereof.

Section, 4833. Failure to List and Assess.

Whenever the supervisor shall, from any cause, have neglected or omitted to place on his list and assess any person within the time required by law, he shall at any time afterwards place the name of any such person on the list, and assess the number of days work to be performed by him which assessment, shall in all respects be valid as if made in time.
