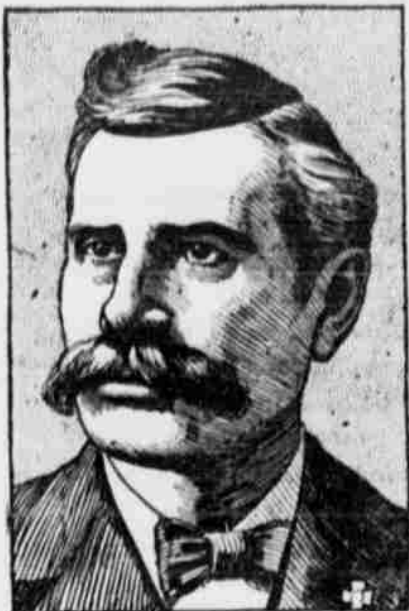

3. Wm. Wood—Name "Alice A." Bay filly. Residence, Dairy, Klamath Co., Or.

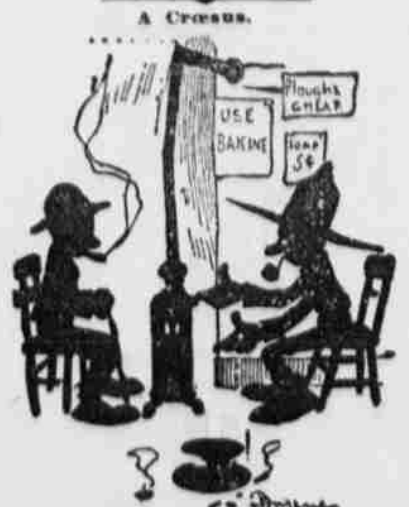
4. Louis Gerber—Name "Barnes" Chestnut stallion, white hind leg, star in forehead. Residence, Lorella, Klamath Co., Or.
