### Kept in Line All Night.

There was a great rush at the Roseburg land office to get filings on timber lands in townships 31 south, range 6 and 10 west, in Douglas county, which were opened for entry last week. There were 35 or 40 applicants in line extending from the door of the U. S. land office at Roseburg out on the sidewalk and far around the corner. The first five of the patient group took their places of vantage right in the entrance to the door at an early hour in the morning, of the day previous, established themselves on camp stools and proceeded to eat their breakfast. The crowd increased with the hours and all night long the vigil was kept up and until 9 o'clock the following morning when there was a grand rush. Special policemen were appointed to preserve order in the crowd. All this goes to show how eagerly Oregon timber land is being sought. Occasionally there is a big rush to arrive at the Lakeview land office ahead of the other fellow.
