

**World's Fair Notes  
St. Louis, Mo.**

World's Fair Clubs are organizing in various parts of the country to prepare for next year's trip to St. Louis.

Brazil expects to spend \$500,000 in gold at the World's Fair, the president of the republic having recommended that amount.

The Association of Master Plumbers will hold its 1904 convention at the Fair.

Many newspapers are conducting voting and other prize contests, the winners to have free trips to the Fair.

Canada's exhibit of fish will embrace the fish from her inland waters, such as Hudson Bay and the Great Lakes, her principal rivers and both sea coasts.

Thirty-five miles of roadway have been constructed within the World's Fair grounds. A large portion of this is asphalt. Most of the roadways are generously shaded, and all are elaborately treated by the landscape architect.

A Canton (Mo.) mill will furnish free trips to the World's Fair for three ladies. A ticket is placed in each sack of flour and the three ladies collecting the largest number of tickets will be the recipient of free tickets to St. Louis and the Exposition.

A World's Fair Exhibit Fund Association has been formed in Missouri to raise funds to provide and maintain a worthy exhibit of the State's products and resources. The State legislature failed to make an appropriation for official participation.

Two contracts for concessions on the Fair at the World's Fair, were let recently. They will be known as the "Magic Whirlpool" and the "Spanish Concession." The latter will be a reproduction of a typical Spanish scene composed of the Court of Lions from the Alhambra and the market place of Granada.

The Wisconsin Outing Club will visit the World's Fair in 1904 in 10 hotel cars. The cars are capable of accommodating 25 persons each. The Club will live during its stay at the Fair in the hotel cars which will be side-tracked close to the Exposition grounds. For this purpose the Club will build its own spur of track.

The total appropriations by Wisconsin to date for the World's Fair amount to \$100,000 and now the citizens of that State purpose to raise \$40,000 more by private subscriptions in order that the State may be adequately represented.

One hundred and twenty-five thousand square yards of sod have been laid in the preparation of World's Fair lawns. In addition, 72 acres have been seeded to blue grass by the Landscape Department.

The World's Fair rose garden, which, when it covered four acres, was the largest in the world, has now been increased to six acres. This site has proven all that was expected, and the young rose bushes are making splendid progress.

A strawberry farm, comprising more than 400 varieties growing on a plot of ground an acre in extent, is a proposed exhibit for the Horticulture Department. Prof. John T. Stinson, Superintendent of Pomology, has charge of the collection of the plants. It is also proposed to have duplicates of the plants growing in pots in the Horticulture Palace, bearing ripe fruit when the Exposition doors are opened.

Virginia creepers have been planted around the site of the Palace of Agriculture by Joseph A. Haddock, superintendent of the out-door planting in the Department of Agriculture. These vines will clamber over and cling to the walls of the great 19-acre structure.

**Oregon's Timber Belt.**

The greatest timber belt in the world is to be found in Western Oregon and Washington, says the Portland Journal. According to government reports Oregon has about 335,000,000,000 feet of standing timber, mostly fir, cedar, hemlock, spruce and larch. As there is now cut in the state about a billion feet annually there is still enough timber left for several hundred years at the same rate of cutting. For shipbuilding, masts, bridge timbers, car sills and other needs demanding a combination of great strength, durability and lightness the Oregon fir is unrivaled. Government tests show that under pressure it has nearly twice the strength of oak and three times that of pine. From each of the five continents the demand for it is continually increasing. The German Emperor's new yacht has Oregon fir for its masts and booms, and the royal standard on Windsor Castle floats from a flagstaff of the same wood.

The receipts of the Oregon State land office for the month of May amounted to \$26,647.71. This is the largest month's receipts in a period of 12 years, with the exception of one month in 1899. When holders of land certificates made payments of arrearages in order to secure a reduction of the rate of interest.
