A. Frankl, brother of J. Frankl, arrived here from Oakland, Cal., Monday, representing the Columbia Mercantile Co. Mr. Frankl was a resident of Lakeview for a number of years, but left here 13 years ago. He says the town has undergone a wonderful change, but that the mountains look familiar.

The city council met in regular session Tuesday night and appointed a committee to investigate J. A. Anthony's electric light plant at New Pine Creek. Mr. Anthony agrees to furnish electricity for the town system for \$100 per month, which will be a saving to the town of about \$150 per month.

Portland people have planned an excursion to Crater Lake next month. Among the distinguished people who will join the party are Dr. Edgar P. Hill, Robert J. Burdette, Governor and Mrs. Chamberlain, Senator Mitchell, Senator and Mrs. Fulton, Hon. Walter F. Mathews, Joaquin Miller and Gen. H. B. Compson.

W. Wilson, B. W. Farrow, who had the horse in charge returned to Paisley Tuesday with the stallion kid.

After being in the hands of an agent for thirty-eight years, Klamath Agency was given the management of a superintendent yesterday in accordance with a law passed by congress last winter, says the Klamath Republican. Capt. O. C. Applegate, who has been the agent, becomes the superintendent and his duties and authority remain about the same as before the change in name.

A glove contest was pulled off in Post & King's hall Monday night before a crowd of 100 people. It was between Phil Barry and Bill Webster. At the 10th round it was called a draw by the City Marshall who stepped in and put a stop to it. The boys got \$25 each. There were two more bouts at the same place Tuesday night. The lands withdrawn are embraced in Townships 44 45, 46, 47 and 48, Range 9; Township 44 Range 10, 11, 12, W 1/4 44 and 45, Range 13; Townships 38, 14, 15 and 16. The lands above described are located on the west side of Goose Lake and extend west and include the Steel Swamp country. It is also given out that another large tract of land in Lassen county has been withdrawn.
