Hanged Himself.

S. Wiley, an employee of the Southern Pacific railroad, committed suicide by hanging himself at Ashland Wednesday night of last week. The Tidings says that he had retired with his wife for the night when some trouble ensued and he arose and went into an adjoining room, where with a clothesline tied about his neck he was found some thirty minutes afterwards cold in death. He had fastened one end of the line to a screw hook used in the ceiling for a hanging lamp, then mounting a chair and with the rope about his neck he kicked this pedestal from under him and was found with his feet just clearing the floor.

Oliver Charlton Injured.

A messenger reached the Chandler ranch in Chewaucan Monday morning from W. Z. Moss' place at Alkali Springs, 70 miles north of Lakeview, and telephoned for a physician to go out and attend Oliver Charlton, who, in some way had broken his leg. No particulars of the accident were learned, but it is known that the leg broke was the one stiff at the knee, and it is supposed that a horse fell on him and caused the fracture. Dr. E. H. Smith started immediately for the place. The accident happened Sunday.

A young man named Anthony, while repairing a telegraph line at New Pine Creek on the 6th inst. was instantly killed by the current of electricity being turned on.

It is expected that one finger will have to be amputated.

A 300-pound Rambouillet.

Before shearing he weighed 289 pounds; and he gave a fleece of 44½ pounds of delaine wool. Neither in size or weight of fleece has any Rambouillet ever equalled these figures, either in France, Germany or the United States. His dam is a ewe presented to Mr. Wyckoff by Baron Von Homeyer in 1891, and regarded as one of the most valuable in that famous flock."
