DISCOURTESY TO OREGON.

(Portland Telegram)

The action of the General Land Office in virtually passing title to a private corporation of the Warner Lake lands, in Lake County, can be viewed in no other light than downright discourtesy to the State of Oregon. The controversy over this land between the settlers and the Warner Valley Stock Company has been thoroughly presented to the public, and is well understood. The settlers found their contention in the principle of abstract justice by right of prior and continued possession and improvement, while the corporation at one time relied upon its title obtained from the state under the swamp act, which was afterwards found to be invalid by reason of the fact that Oregon had never obtained a patent from the General Government.

As a matter of justice, and probably as a matter of legal right, the state was not entitled to a patent, as the lands had been redeemed by the energy and enterprise of the settlers to an area that was highly cultivated. The attorneys for the corporation become the self-constituted agents of the state, and despite the protest of the Governor, the General Land Office hands over to these gentlemen all that they desire. The state authorities declare that the action was as unprecedented as it was unwarranted. Whatever motives prompted the officials in the General Land Office, the average citizen of this state must be pardoned for speculating on the particular kind of pull the representatives of a private concern may have that is more effective than the legally expressed wishes of the Chief Executive of an American Commonwealth.
