Reconnoitering Reservoir Sites. (Ashiand Tidings)

H. E. Green and J. E. Reese, of the hydrographic branch of the United States Geological Survey, arrived in Ashland, Thursday evening, in their overland road outfit drawn by four horses, from Red Bluff, Cal. They are in the reclamation service and from here crossed the mountains on an investigating and exploration trip to locate eligible sites for storage reservoirs of waters to be used in the reclamation of arid lands. Their prospective route takes them to Pelican Bay, Fort Klamath, Klamath Agency, the Sprague River valley, Bly and Bonanza, Mr. Green said that before completing their present expedition that Goose Lake, all of the Modoc lava beds and the Honey Lake district would be covered. When a reservoir site is located they do the necessary surveying, and later will be followed by crews of construction men, who will build the basins as mapped out. Messrs, Green and Reese will be in the field until the winter storms set in an compel them to suspend operations for the season.

This is the first advent into South ern Oregon of Government hydrographers for the purpose of conserv ing waters in the reclamation of arid land since the passage of the irrigation act by congress.
