

The Jackrabbit Problem.

An enterprising Oregon firm has discovered a rational way of disposing of the jackrabbit, ridding the country of what has been hitherto regarded as an agricultural pest and adding an important item to the stock of eatables, a luxury highly prized by epicures, says the Chronicle.

The jackrabbit is the Pacific Coast prototype of the English hare, corresponding closely to the latter in size, form, habits and color and taste of the flesh. When an English hare is properly cooked and served it constitutes one of the daintiest dishes produced in the British Isles.

If the Oregon venture proves successful, and there is no good reason why it should not, the jackrabbit problem, which has perplexed California even more than any other Pacific State, will be in a fair way of being solved.
