

Klamath Lake Railroad Improvement.

(Ashland Tidings.)

Hervey Lindley, of the Klamath River Railroad, was in Ashland, Tuesday, on his way home from a business trip at Portland. He says the open cars which have been in service on his road from Lairds to Pokagama, since the trains began to run, will be superseded in a few days by a comfortable combination passenger and baggage coach. He has also notified the government that the road is ready to carry the Klamath Falls mail whenever it is desired to make the change from Ashland.

Mr. Lindley says that active measures will be taken in the near future looking to the extension of the road to Klamath Falls. The portion of the road constructed has surmounted all the heavy grades between Lairds and Klamath Falls, and its extension from Pokagama will be comparatively an easy matter. Mr. Lindley says the enterprise up to date represents an investment of over \$600,000.

The Klamath Lake Railroad has not been carrying the United States mail heretofore on account of being unprepared to properly handle the same. Not wishing to undertake the service until equipped with a suitable coach. They have been carrying passengers all summer and fall in either open air or freight cars. The public have not complained and appreciated the service just the same.

Mr. Lindley says that with his new rolling stock, the road will be prepared to give first class accommodations equal to the facilities of the main line. The road is well built and cost \$600,000. Mr. Lindley is enthusiastic over the further extension of the road into Klamath county. No bonus will be asked from the people.

For Tests of Timber.

Senator Mitchell has introduced and will press a bill during the regular session of Congress appropriating \$40,000 to defray the expenses of investigation and tests of American timber, to determine the actual strength of timbers of various kinds and sizes. He proposes that the work shall be carried on by the bureau of Forestry, of the Department of Agriculture, and when the subject has been carefully and thoroughly investigated, the results shall be published for the benefit of timber users. His bill stipulates that no less than 90 per cent of the amount appropriated shall be expended in investigating timbers of the Pacific Coast States agree to furnish land and buildings for a testing laboratory.




Klamath-Lake-Railroad TIME TABLE. In Effect June 28th, 1903.


