

Senator Mitchell Entertains.

U. S. Senator John H. Mitchell of Oregon gave a brilliant and notable dinner in Washington, last week. There were 52 guests including many members of Congress and prominent diplomats. The banquet was given by Senator Mitchell for the purpose of introducing his colleague, Senator C. W. Fulton. It soon resolved itself, however, into a Lewis and Clark Exposition love feast.

Shortly after Senator Mitchell in a speech presented his colleague, Mr. Fulton responded in a happy vein. Senator Dooliver broke through the formalities in a brilliant National endorsement of the Lewis and Clark Exposition. He said that having visited Oregon and the Pacific Coast and come to realize the future of the commerce of the Pacific, he could not but pledge his own support to a bill that would prove an educator, and would enlighten the entire country as to conditions, prospects and opportunities of the extreme West, and especially in its relations to the Orient.

Congressman Grosvenor, of Ohio, a most influential member of the House, expressed himself as favorable to all expositions, and promised his support to the pending measure.

Many other influential senators and representatives followed with speeches in which they pledged support to the exposition.
