Dear Sir: Your favor is at hand, and I am gratified to hear from you.

Your suggestions as to Warner Mountain Forest Reserve are correct. The difficulty there is the same as applies elsewhere. No sufficient examination was made by Department agents, and hence large areas of good agricultural and grazing lands are included in various reserves and withdrawals, to the great detriment and injury of the stock and farming interests of our country.

Thousands of homeseekers who would utilize the lands now withdrawn are turned away, and places that would make comfortable homes are uselessly placed inside of forest reserves. The facts should be placed before the Secretary of the Interior and the President. That petition of two hundred and fifty names should come to the Secretary. The boards of trade and the county court should also protest, setting forth specifically the relief that is asked for.
