The senate committee on public lands after a hot session of three hours finally agreed upon a compromise bill to be reported. The Quarels bill was the groundwork for warm debate and came very near being brought to a vote, which would have resulted in the bill being favorably reported upon by the committee. The Quarels bill repeals the timber and stone act, the desert land act and the commutation clause in the homestead act without offering any substitute for these land laws. Three of the republican members of the committee would have voted with the democrats, thus giving the supporters of the bill one majority. Only dilatory tactics on the part of Chairman Hansbrough prevented a vote. A compromise bill was agreed upon which would receive the support of a majority of the committee. The compromise bill repeals the timber and stone act, but provides for remedial legislation. Timber will be sold, under this bill, to the highest bidder under sealed proposals, and will amend the desert land act by striking out the assignment clause. The homestead act will also be amended by extending the time of actual residence upon a homestead before taking advantage of the commutation clause, from fourteen months to twenty-four months.

The Supreme court of the United States handed down a decision on March 14th in the case of the Northern Securities Company vs. the United States, in favor of the government's contention that the merger was illegal. Governor Van Sant of Minnesota was highly elated over the result of the case. President Roosevelt was well pleased, as was Attorney-General Knox.

The Direct Primary law will be placed on the ballot to be cast on June 6th, and it is the duty of every voter to secure a copy of this law and study it out for himself, and not rely upon its recommendation by any faction or party. The bill is at your disposal, and there is no reason why you should go to the polls unqualified to cast an intelligent vote on this subject.

The unfriendly sentiment in the United States toward Russia believed to have been greatly enlarged upon by Germany and Great Britain for diplomatic purposes, has caused Russia to cancel large shipments from our ports. American trade with Russia will be greatly hampered if our true feeling toward it is not soon restored.

The direct primary law is so intricate that it will require a close scrutiny by the voter to digest its full meaning. We suggest that the voters of Lake county make a personal investigation before election day, as it will cost them nothing but a request to secure a copy of the law from the county clerk.

Chicago manufacturers and wholesalers have a \$1,000,000 cargo ready for exportation to Russian ports, and they feel that the neutrality restrictions seriously menace the trade of this country which has cost America so much to secure.

The Republican State convention of Kansas was held on the 9th, and the delegation was instructed for Roosevelt. The machine men were routed.
