

MEN NARROWLY ESCAPE DEATH.

Four men came very near losing their lives in a 42-inch water pipe near Redding a few days ago while painting the inside of the huge water pipe that is to furnish water for a large power plant—in fact their escape was miraculous. The pipe runs down a steep mountain for 1800 feet and has a 500-ft fall in the distance. The pipe line is a new one and the riveting had just been completed and the pipe was receiving an interior finish. Four manholes are in the pipe line, three of which had been closed, the one remaining open was 700 feet from the top. The men were working near the top when the dam that had been made to turn the water washed out, turning a head of water into the pipe. The men were startled to find themselves in such a predicament and as they began to be forced down the mountain through the pipe. When the open manhole was reached, though moving at almost lightning speed, each man as he came in sight of the light made the effort of his life and they all saved themselves. Had they passed this place they would have all met death at the bottom of the pipe line, even if they had reached the bottom alive.

Garden Party Toilet.

The garden party gown here illustrated is made of cream silk voile. The bolero is made with groups of plaits and is bordered with lace in section and bands of the material, of which the little round yoke and collar are also made. This trimming, with

and bands, forms the heading to a ruche edged ruffle of cream mousseline de soie, which finishes the bottom of the bolero.

The upper part of the sleeve is of the material, trimmed in the same way, the trimming forming a heading to two deep ruche edged ruffles of the mousseline de soie, which fall over a puff of the same material, finished with a lace cuff.

The skirt has a hip yoke with groups of plaits and bordered with the lace and bands. To this the skirt is slightly gathered all round. The girdle is of satin.—Wiener Mod.-Album.

A Popular Neck Ornament.

Dainty fashion has decreed that the fluffy boas of tulle, brussels net, ostrich feathers and chiffon, with the long, fluttering ends that have been the pride of woman for the last few months, shall be banished until the autumn. The drooping shoulder effect striven for this summer demands that all neckwear be perfectly flat. The favorite neck ornament for outdoor wear is the empire stole or collar. This fits on the shoulders like a flat collarette, with the edges in a rounded curve. The long stole ends are not always in one piece, but frequently come from underneath the collar and fall more smoothly, as the collar is not then dragged down from the shoulders by the weight of the stoles. These collars are sometimes made of etamine and net in a double thickness.

The Blouse.

When a blouse is made of very good face severe simplicity is best, and the woman who is not too thin will do well to have it made to fasten plainly at the back, with a little fullness pouching at the waist in front and the yoke piece kept as transparent as possible. Thin people should reverse this order of things and fasten the blouse in front with an enormous jabot of lace and with falling frills of the same over the hands. In all cases the sleeves are fairly voluminous from the elbow, and here may be introduced an undersleeve of chiffon or net.

The attractive blouse here illustrated is of tussore silk forming a box plaited bolero and sleeves trimmed
