## THE COUNTY CONVENTION.

### Good County Ticket Nominated-- Resolutions Favorable to Roosevelt and Mitchell.

The Republican county convention met at the court house last Saturday at 10 o'clock a. m., and the following temporary officers were elected:

Report by Committee on Resolutions and Platform read and unanimously adopted.

Report of committee on Resolutions and Platform--

"We, your committee on Resolutions and Platform beg leave to report as follows:

"First; Resolved that we heartily endorse the able and successful administration of President Theodore Roosevelt, commend his untiring efforts in behalf of an honest and capable conduct of the several departments of the government, and support the action of the administration

in so successfully carrying out the plans of the Panama Canal. Also that we are unanimously in favor of the nomination of Theodore Roosevelt for the next candidate for President.

"Second; Resolved, that having the utmost confidence in the ability and integrity of Senator John H. Mitchell, he having demonstrated his great value as Oregon's champion in congress, we do hereby unqualifiedly endorse him as preeminently the best man to succeed himself as United States Senator from our state.

## EASTER PROGRAM.

### Sunday School Entertains Large House--Songs and Recitations Well Received.

The Sunday School of the Methodist church in Lakeview commemorated Easter by giving a concert in the evening. The church was decorated for the occasion with potted plants, and in the center of the pulpit was a cross wreathed with Easter lilies.

The music was appropriate, consisting of selections by the choir and by the different classes of the Sunday School. Every number was a marked success but among the most pleasing selections was the motion song by little girls from the primary class and a duet rendered by Miss Ruth Nickerson and Mr. Phelps.

The program was interspersed with recitations, all of which were much appreciated, little Floretta Graham fairly captivating the audience.

Short addresses were made by Mr. Valandingham, superintendent of the Sunday School and by Rev. Stark, pastor of the church. At the close of the program the audience was called upon for a donation toward Sunday School supplies, and a collection was taken amounting to four dollars.

The Sunday School will no doubt feel encouraged at the interest shown by so large an audience, as the church was crowded to overflowing.

The concert, as well as the decorations, was under the charge of Mrs. Chrisman who deserves great credit for her faithful work.

### Almost A Fatality.

### Monthly Weather Report.

What is a pretty good showing for a semi-arid section like Lake has been considered, is the precipitation during the months of February and March. For the two months 9.28 inches of water fell in Lakeview according to the government's weather bureau at this place. February, with 4.75 inches leads with the greatest amount of water for the corresponding month since the weather bureau has been established here, and March is a close follower with 4.53 inches.

These figures are of great importance in preparing reports on irrigation projects to be considered by the government.
