The most powerful gun ever invented is now being made for the United States. It is expected to shoot through 6 inches of solid steel with a 6-inch projectile weighing 100 pounds at a distance of 30 miles. The gun is made up of thin sheet steel in sections and wound with fine steel wire. The tension in winding the wire is so great that when completed, the gun has been put to a greater test than it is ever expected to withstand in being fired. If the 6-inch gun comes up to the expectations of its inventor, larger ones will be made on the same plan. It is estimated that a 10-inch gun of the same make will carry a 600 pound projectile 50 miles, and a 12-inch gun would shoot 100 miles, the 1000 pound shell reaching a height of 17 miles.
