Views of W. J. Bryan

Chicago, April 23-Wm. J. Bryan addressed a large audiance tonight in the armory of the Second infantry The meeting was entirely an affair of Bryan's, he having rented the armory and paid all expenses of the meeting. He was particular to have it understood that his address was not in favor or against any particular aspirant for the democratic nomination for president.

His subject was the New York platform. This he repeated several times during his speech. Mr. Bryan year. was his own presiding officer.

"Judge Parker is not a fit man to be nominated either by the democratle party or any other party that stands for honesty or fair dealing in polities.

"The New York platform is ambignous, uncertain, evasive and dishonest. It would disgrace the democrats of the nation to adopt such a platform, and it ought to defeat as an aspirant for a democratic nomination any man who would willingly have it go forth as a declaration of his views.

"Can anyone doubt that with such a platform the party would be mortgaged beforehand to the corpora-

The president to be elected this fall will doubtless have the appointment of one or two, and possibly three, supreme court judges. If his sympathies are with the corporations he will doubtless appoint judges satisfactory to the corporations.

"With a candidate willing to run upon the New York platform the party could secure as large a campaign fund as the republican party ever received.

"The issue presented today in the trust question and in all others with which we have to deal, is the question between human rights and the so-called property rights.

"If we are to take the platform as an indication of what the next democratic platform is to be, then we will be unable to deny the secret purpose of the reorganizers to turn the party over to predatory wealth.

"I, for one, am not willing that the democratic party shall become the tool of the corporations; I am not willing that it shall become the champion of organized wealth."-Oregonian.
