

Vote For Bill No. 300.

EDITOR EXAMINER:

It is not the purpose of this article to write against the liquor traffic, but to present the proposed law in its true light, and ask the people to vote for it on election day.

All civilized countries attempt to regulate the sale of intoxicants in some way. Oregon statutes provide for license, granted upon petition which must be published with signatures.

Many persons may refuse to sign petitions for license because of the publicity given their action. Or they may sign the petition because not willing to offend by refusing, when, if they could vote secretly against the license, they would. The only way to get the true sentiments of all voters on any question, has been to oblige by law, under penalties, all voting to be done by secret ballot. Why not do so in this matter?

Again, if this bill becomes law, the people, if they so vote, can banish from a precinct the traffic in liquors in any quantity. If a community desires a liquor business in any form, they should have the right to it and the right to express their wishes secretly, as on all other matters of state. If they are opposed to the sale of liquors in their local community, they should have the right to express their opposition by some secret means. As a voter, I say that if this bill should become a law upon a proposition to suppress the traffic in liquors in Lake county, I should vote for license to sell. But as applied to my own, country community, I should vote against license.

This is fair and just to all. This is the true republican, democratic, American practice. Give the people a chance by the secret ballot to regulate their local affairs, by voting Yes for No. 300 on your ballot next June.

Mays Land Inspected

W. W. Scott, an agent of the Interior department, arrived on the stage from Lakview Monday. Mr. Scott came to examine the land selected under the Carey act by the Portland Irrigation company, and Tuesday went over the tract. His duty is simply to report on the character of the land, whether it is stone, swamp, timber or desert, or will grow a crop without irrigation. He said he could give out nothing for publication, but it should not be hard to surmise what the report will be.

It is expected that President Mays when he arrives here on the 14th will take steps looking to the inauguration of work.

The reclamation of this tract will be of great benefit to the stockmen who will get cheaper hay.—Paisley Post.

Bought Many Horses.
