A few Points for Depositors

The First National Bank of Lakeview is temporarily located in the C. U. Snider store building. The new bank building will be already to be occupied this summer.

We call your attention to a few of which is required of National Banks. requirement that detailed reports of the condition of each National Bank, or cashier, and attested by not less than three of its directors, shall, not Fred Bartley, of Lakeview, Oregon. less than five times in each year, be made to the Comptroller, and shall also be published in a newspaper published in the place where the Bank is established.

Another additional requirement, and an invaluable one, is that a Bank Examiner appointed by the Comptroller, examines periodically the National Banks, inspects the acments and suggests methods to get counts, securities, assets and liabilities and have power to examine the officers and directors under oath.

> National Banks are prohibited from loaning to any person, corporation or firm, an amount exceeding one-tenth of their capital stock.

> They are further prohibited from making any loan or discount on the security of the shares of their own capital stock, also from becoming indebted or in any way liable to an amount exceeding that of their capital stock actually paid in.




