

Slow to Catch On.

The Red Bluff "People's Cause," whose editor has either been out fishing for several months, or been asleep, while all the excitement in Lake county over the sheep killing was going on, has only recently discovered that there has been range trouble in Oregon.

Following is some of the latest news clipped from that paper. Its editor ought to be informed that he has several months behind the times.

"The trouble between the stock and sheep men of Southern Oregon becomes more desperate. Every day reports are received of sheep being poisoned and killed on the ranges. The trouble seems to be centered in Lake county. Several flocks in that county have been almost exterminated.

A few days ago conditions were such that sheepmen appealed to Oregon's governor for protection. He responded by offering a reward of \$1000 for the arrest and conviction of the parties guilty of depredations. Thus far no arrests have been made.

Last Sunday a meeting of the Wool Grower's Association was held at Antelope and an additional reward of \$500 was authorized for the arrest and conviction of any person willfully killing or poisoning sheep. Despite this, sheep are being found dead.

Monday another meeting was held. At the meeting the sheep and Wool Grower's Association was formed.

Thousands of head of sheep and cattle are now feeding on the ranges in Lake county. The cattle will not graze over land over which sheep have passed. The stockmen as a result have a dislike for sheep owners and the only course that can put an end to this is either the removal of one or the other faction, or the agreement of a grazing territory for sheep and cattle.

For some time strong efforts have been made to reach some understanding. In the meantime the killing of sheep has continued, until now it would not take much to start trouble between the parties whose interests are at stake."
