

Woman Wins \$2,500.

TOLEDO, O., July 21, (Special)—Probably no one was more surprised than was Mrs. Herbert Tetlow, Washingtonville, Ohio, when the postmaster delivered to her an envelope containing a certified check for \$2,500, signed by the Woolson Spice Company of Toledo, Ohio.
