The annual report of Pension Commissioner Ware, made public last week, shows that the Government has dealt very liberally with pension claimants in the Northwest during the past year, as evidenced by a large increase in the number of pensions and in the amounts of money paid. In Oregon, where there were 6177 pensioners in 1903, and with pensions aggregating \$778,773, there were during last year 7067 pensioners, to whom the Government paid \$968,928.
