

Say Beef Buyers Discriminate.
The apparent discrimination made by beef buyers in the northern counties is cause for a kick on the part of Crook county stockmen. From 1/2 cent to one cent per pound more is paid in counties north of Crook than is paid there for beef. In some instances the quality of beef may cut some figure, but Crook county cattlemen who have watched the prices contend that it is not so much the grade of cattle as it is the section of country from which buyers are taking cattle. In the northern counties where beef has been shipped East when prices did not suit the raisers of Crook whose locality makes it inconvenient for transportation to the Eastern market. This seems to them a discrimination wholly unwarranted, and one they believe to be unjust.
