

**Rev. Summerville's Work Appreciated.**

Rev. D. T. Summerville, who, as presiding elder of the Grants Pass district, has just completed his sixth and last year, was given a special token of recognition of his faithful and arduous service at the Eugene conference on Thursday. Rev. Sanford Snyder, on behalf of the brethren of the district, presented resolutions of appreciation and as an expression of the high esteem in which he is held, presented him with a beautiful dictionary. Mr. Summerville responded feelingly and appropriately to these expressions. The district covered by Mr. Summerville's labors covers all of Southern Oregon, embracing two territories of 25,000 square miles, with only 200 miles of railroad. During the past year, in this district three new churches, and one parsonage and another church have been provided for at North Bend and a remodelled parsonage at Lakeview. Ashland Tidings.
