To Author of Famous Hymn.
A brass tablet has been placed in the chancel of Farnham Parish church to the memory of Rev. Augustus Montagu Toplady, author of the hymn, "Rock of Ages," who was a native of the town. The inscription states that Rev. Augustus M. Toplady was born November 4, 1740, died in London August 11, 1778, and was buried in Tottenham Court chapel, London, August 17, 1778. Toplady, who was a strong defender of Calvinism, a great controversialist and author of many poems on sacred subjects, was at one time vicar of Broad Hembury, in Devonshire, and in 1775 preached in a chapel near Leicester Fields, London.—London Express.

Railways in High Latitudes.
