

Dairy Tests at the Fair.

PORTLAND, Nov. 28th. Dairying tests have been decided upon by the exposition management to be a feature of the live stock show at the Lewis and Clark Centennial. One month will be given to the tests, which will begin September 1, 1905. A full set of rules and regulations to govern the tests has been compiled by Richard Scott and W. K. Ladd, who have formulated a schedule by which the greatest possible benefit may be obtained from the contests.

Butter tests will be supervised by a competent jury, and uniform packages will be provided by the Exposition for all butter produced by each breed. The scale of points for judging butter is as follows:

Flavor, 30 per cent. Color, 15 percent
Aroma, 15 " " Salt, 10 " "
Grain, 15 " " Package 5 " "

The milk from each cow will be weighed immediately after milking, and correct samples will be taken. Awards will be made on the following points:

Economic production of butter and butter fat; economic production of milk for all purposes of dairying; dual-purpose beef, milk, and beef merits of calf; production of market milk; all on herds of five, ten and 15 cows.

Similar tests, with awards, will be made on individual cows of the Ayrshire, Brown Swiss, Devon, Guernsey, Holstein-Friesian, Jersey, Red Polled and Short Horn breeds. There will also be awards for the best cows of any breed.

The amounts of the various awards are now being figured out and will be announced at an early date.

UNPROFITABLE FEEDING

Intelligent stock raisers know that a certain amount of feed is necessary to keep an animal alive. They might feed that amount as long as it lives, and it would never gain a pound.

There is no profit in that kind of feeding. The kind that pays is the kind that builds flesh rapidly. If it takes twenty pounds of food each day to keep a sheep alive, twenty-five pounds a day will make it gain flesh. It's the extra five that brings the profit. The first five pounds amounts to nothing, nor does the second or third or fourth five pounds.

It's the same way with advertising. You have to do a certain amount to overcome the resistance of the public.

You have to do a certain amount of advertising to make them wake up to the fact that you are in business at all. You have to pay a certain amount to keep your advertising alive. What you pay above that amount brings profit.

Some advertisers fail because they do not use enough space. They use barely enough or sometimes not quite enough to make the advertising self sustaining. A little bit more would make it profitable. It is better to advertise a little too much than not quite enough.—Charles Austin Bates.


