DURATION OF TELEPHONE POLES.

The length of service of a telegraph or telephone pole is determined in a section of the pole not more than a foot or a foot and a half long. In a standing pole this section extends about six or eight inches above and below the top of the ground.

The experiments already made by the Bureau show conclusively that poles can be subjected to a preservative treatment which insures materially lengthened service. This treatment consists in impregnating the wood with antiseptics which prevent the growth of the fungi that cause decay.

When it is known that decay, in a certain number of years, cuts the diameter from perhaps 12 to 8 inches, and that below 8 inches the weakened pole falls, the course to be pursued is obvious.

an 8-inch diameter rather than a 12-inch. The 4 inches saved represent a tremendous difference in the size and age of trees used for poles.

Another feature of the cooperative work will be treatment of cross-arms. The companies have been treating them, but report too much absorption in some cases and not enough in others.
