

Supervision of Freights.

While it is admitted that railroads are in a sense private property, they have derived their existence from the state and are engaged in a purely public service for which alone they were intended.

The President in an address delivered at a banquet of the Union League in Philadelphia announced his firm determination of the American people; that they will not permanently tolerate the use of that power conferred by vast wealth especially in its corporate form, without lodging somewhere in the government the still higher power seeing that this power, in addition to being used in the interest of the individual possessing it, is also used for and against the interests of the people as a whole.

This states the whole case of the people, and the President is their natural representative and attorney, so that their purpose is carried out. The people know that the railroads have not given to each man and each community even justice. They know that discriminations have been made against communities, and to the advantage of others more favored. They know that the individual small shipper has been shamelessly discriminated against, at the expense of large corporations. They have resolved upon putting a period to this unjust practice now, and we trust the lawyer who attempts to prevent the accomplishment of that purpose.

The House of Representatives in Washington has reported a substitute for the bill passed by the Senate, providing for the Klamath irrigation project, and it has apparently a good prospect of passing, when it meets the approach of chairman Mondell, who opposed the Senate bill.

Since 1849 it is estimated that the various counties have spent nearly one hundred millions on roads, and the little accomplished by it is visible everywhere. And the same waste of money in the same direction is going on at the rate of several millions annually. The most crying need of the present is permanent roads and laws which will compel their construction. We have already made shifts enough and to spare.—Exchange.

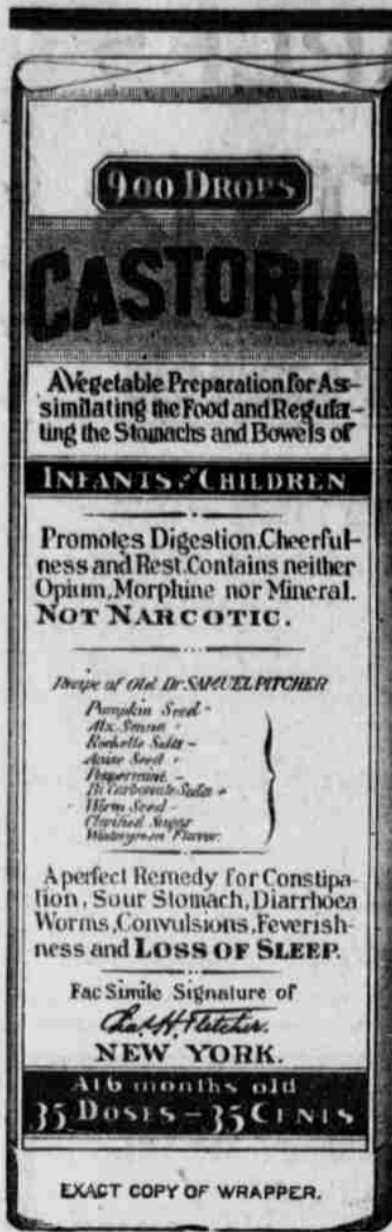
