One dispatch shows that the goverument has resolved to convene a popular assembly. Another casts doubt upon it. A dispatch will show that Witte enjoys full confidence of the Czar and is in full power and again another dispatch shows that his house has been searched by order of the Czar, for incriminating papers. Strikes continue throughout the empire, especially in Poland. without any definate purpose.
