An explosion in a factory in Massachusetts, where several hundred workmen, both men and women, were employed, caused a total destruction of the factory and the loss of life of somewhere between 60 and 80 persons. The property loss will amount to \$250,000.

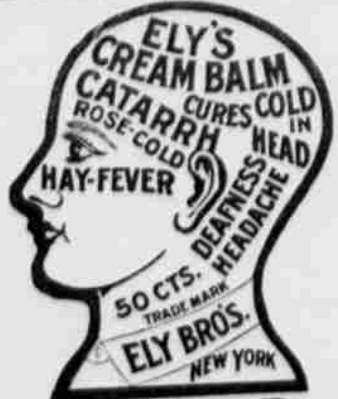

The figures given out by the Interstate Commerce Commission in its fiscal report are enormous. The report shows that in 1904 there were 209,002 miles of railroads operating in the United States, the gross earnings amounted to \$1,966,633,821. Of this amount \$1,377,684,976, or 70.06 per cent., was received from the freight service, \$529,428,374 or 27.43 per cent., from passenger service and \$69,529,471, or 3.51 per cent., from miscellaneous sources. Over \$1,332,382,948 was spent in operating the roads. The income for the railroads was \$725,037,557. The railroads pay \$60,000,000 in taxes.

A new type of engine has been ordered for the Southern Pacific railroad, which, if proves what is claimed for it, will revolutionize modern transportation. It is claimed the new type of engine will run 3000 miles without a stop, making 100 miles an hour. Oil is the only fuel to be purchased, and the expense is one-half that for operating the steam engine now in use. The new type of engine is called the four stroke cylinder.

The Corning (Calif.) Observer says that sheep shearing will begin in that section about April first. The wool crop bids fair to be good, and the Observer further adds that, after the wool is all hauled to town the market will open, and as the wool crop is short all over the world, the price will probably go above 20 cts.
