

# AN INDIAN WAR STORY

In which Figured one of Goose Lake's Prominent Farmers—John O'Neil Fought Indians in 1858 in the Palouse Country.

Many a traveler passing among the grain fields and meadow lands of the famed Palouse country, noting the wealth of improved and thickly laid out farms, the triumph of quiet and peaceful occupancy, little suspects that the white man's possession of that fertile region was at one time bitterly contested by the Indian tribes which are now crowded beyond its borders. In fact, not many of the residents of that country realize that bloody encounters have occurred among the hills and valleys between United States soldiers and Spokane, Coeur d'Alene and other Indian tribesmen, and that 50 years ago the white man who ventured to cross that, then, unbroken grass covered plain, on his way to or from the Canadian boundary, or in a coastwise direction, was fortunate indeed if, before reaching his destination, his scalp was not required of him.

In 1858, less than 50 years ago, occurred the most notable military expeditions into and through the Palouse country of which we have any history, namely, those of Colonel Steptoe and Wright. Unfortunately, of the details of these the history we have is mainly traditional, burdened heavily with the fictions.

Not few survivors.

There are now but few survivors of those expeditions, and, probably, as few of the Indians who opposed them, left to tell the story. The writer, therefore, considered himself especially fortunate in a recent acquaintance with a man who participated in both expeditions, and from whom he has learned many details of those events which were never found in any published record. This gentleman is John O'Neil, who now resides just on the California side of the line between that state and Oregon, and whose property abuts against the limits of the town of New Pine Creek, which is on the Oregon side.

Although rounding well his three score years and ten, Mr. O'Neil is still vigorous in health and his tall, rugged form bears with apparent ease the results of hardships that have fallen to his lot in numerous successful years during a life spent on the frontier and in mining regions since early manhood. As he relates his experiences with hostile Indians, the kindness of his eye and the zest displayed when the narrative portrays particularly close and dangerous situations, convince one that, in his younger days, he would have been a formidable foe on any battlefield and yet he complains but slightly on his personal exploits. He enlisted in the army service in New York city in 1850, and was mustered out at Vancouver in 1860. His integrity is unquestioned and he enjoys the esteem of all who know him.

MR. O'NEIL'S NARRATIVE.

Following is a brief account of the Steptoe and Wright expeditions as Mr. O'Neil related it:

In the spring of 1858, Colonel Steptoe, commander of Fort Walla Walla

received a request from the Coeur d'Alene and Spokane tribes to come into their country for the purpose of holding a council with a view to arriving at a treaty settling the question of a route through their country and other questions incidental to travel thereupon. Accordingly, with one company of cavalry, consisting of 100 men and three Nez Perce scouts, he set out from Walla Walla very early in May. One howitzer was taken with them, and each man was provided with 40 rounds of ammunition.

Snake river was crossed at what was then known as "Red Wolf crossing," which was near the mouth of Alpowa creek. Proceeding northward, approaching the mountains, and following, for the greater part, the Indian trails, they must have crossed the North Palouse river not very far west of where Palouse now is. They passed east of Steptoe butte and Mr. O'Neil is of the opinion that the butte on the west and the mountains on the east were about equidistant from the route traversed.

As Steptoe had been requested to make this trip, his approach was evidently being watched for by the Indians, and before the company reached the North Palouse "Indian sign" was observed and a little later small parties of Indians were discovered headed toward the north.

INDIANS BECAME INSOLENT.

On Saturday evening the command reached a point which Mr. O'Neil thinks is about ten miles north of Steptoe butte, and went into camp on a stretch of bottom land, portions of which were quite swam-
