Felix Green, foreman for the 70 cattle firm, informed us that he had commenced haying on the Chewaucan ranch. He has nine mowers running since last Tuesday. Mr. Green says the hay is short this year on that ranch. Where he had 21 stacks last year he will only have about 10 this year. Nevertheless he had about 2,000 tons left over from last year which will make as much to begin the winter with as they had last winter, and as the range is good, and cattle will come in fat, no shortage of winter feed is expected.

Mr. Green says the beef will be fat this fall and should bring a good price. If it was not so far from the railroad, all beef would go on the market this fall ready for the block and bring a big price.

Most of the 70 beef are on the reservation, in the Sican country. Felix will make a trip to Sican shortly to look at the cattle.
