

Idaho Land Frauds.
LEWISTON, Idaho, July 21.—The first warrants issued in the Idaho land fraud cases and based on indictments found by a special grand jury at Boise last week reached here today, and were served upon George H. Kester, cashier of the Lewiston National Bank, and C. W. Robnett, bookkeeper of that institution. Each provided a bond in the sum of \$2000 for appearance before the Federal Court for the trial at Moscow in October.

The grand jury found nine indictments based on alleged land frauds in the Lewiston district, and warrants in the other cases, it is understood, will soon be served.

W. F. Kettenbach, president of the Lewiston National Bank, is among those indicted. Mr. Kettenbach is now in Portland attending the Washington Bankers' Convention. Messrs. Kettenbach and Kester are prominent citizens of Lewiston—Oregonian.

They expect to have the park completed by September first, when the county fair opens. A big base ball tournament will be held off there during fair week, and a \$1000 purse will be hung up.
