A plot has been discovered to assassinate the Czar of Russia on September 7th. In case the plans failed another attempt is planned for three weeks later.

During 1894, according to a parliamentary report just submitted, 1073 persons were killed by accidents connected with running of trains and movements of railway vehicles, or \$6 less than in the year before. Casualties from train accidents show a very marked decrease.

The Eisemee station on the railway that is being built up the Jungfrau mountain in Switzerland was opened on August 1; it is 3155 meters above the sea level. It is expected that the summit station (4167 meters) will be reached in 1910. From the Eisemee the ascent on foot requires 10 hours.




