Portland is just now beginning to figure how they are to get the trade of the Klamath Basin over the West road which has a terminus on the Southern Pacific line 410 miles from Portland and 325 miles from San Francisco. It appears that as San Francisco helped to promote the extension of the West road to Klamath Falls, or rather to get the movement under headway, that city did its figuring before much was said about where the line into the interior should intersect the main line of the S. P. Portland will no doubt be using the same figures in solving the problem of getting the trade of Lake county over a road contemplated from the north while the N.C.O. is being actually extended by Mr. Gould, who now owns the road.

Reno papers are giving the Goose Lake mines wide publicity. What is hoped is that no false reports be sent to the Reno papers from the scene of the strike that might cause any unwarranted excitement to outsiders, and bring a rush of people here to find they had been misled; as was the case during the Klondike excitement. Of course it is now generally believed that the diggings are rich, but a lot of false reports might work a great damage to the country. Draw a picture of ten thousand people rushing to Goose Lake valley this time of year, where there is no railroad to bring in supplies, and knowing that there is never much of a surplus raised because of the absence of railroads.

While the peace conference is going on both Russia and Japan are preparing for war. Prince Walkowsky said to a reporter:

"Peace is impossible. President Roosevelt's last attempt to bring Russia and Japan to an agreement has failed, because the Czar has solemnly promised his people to pay not a single kopek of tribute and to surrender not an inch of territory. Never since it became an empire has Russia paid tribute or ceded territory. The first ruler of the nation who does either of these things signs his own death warrant. Such payment, however disguised, would provoke a revolution."

A pretty 16-year-old girl at Redlands, Calif., recently chased a burglar a mile and a half with a buggy whip and then captured him, made him walk back to the ranch with her and remain there until help came. The act was considered one of the bravest on record. Show us the man who wouldn't surrender to a pretty 16-year-old when the penalty was walking a mile and a half with her and staying at the house till help came, with only an officer to face at the close of the scene.

It is difficult to see what is expected to be accomplished by the many conflicting reports that have gone out from the mines near Pine Grove. If to promote the scheme is the desire, there is no surer way of killing than to send out such reports. If the object is for the betterment of the country, the result falls flat and if somebody is making money at it they should resort to a more honorable means.

Los Angeles has a "boosters club" with a membership of 250,000. Think of the good a "boosters' club" could do in Lakeview even with a membership of 250; all working together for the upbuilding of Lakeview and Lake county.

We have a sample copy of the "Western Publisher" on our desk that slid out of a huge stack of morning's mail to a most conspicuous place and occupies a top position in a stack of "marked" papers. The Western Publisher is a Chicago publication and is a most valuable one to the newspaper man. It deals with many subjects that often aggravate the editor of a newspaper, such as what he calls "Free Advertising".

The two physicians appointed by King Edward at the time of King Alfonso's visit to England, to report upon the physical condition of the King of Spain, reported that the King was suffering from phthisis and showed signs of insanity. The negotiations for the young King's marriage to Princess Patricia, of Connaught was broken off at once.

Judge John E. Baker of Alturas, one of the California delegates to the Trans-Mississippi Commercial Congress in session in Portland, made himself known to the other delegates by his firm stand against the proposed resolution against Chinese exclusion. However, the congress was so well organized that his bitter fight availed nothing.

Officials of the Western Pacific R. Co. announce that the bonds of that railroad have been increased from \$50,000,000 to \$75,000,000, and that contracts for construction work will soon be made public. Money is now available for all immediate demands and work will begin at once.

It is stated upon good authority now that the Columbia Southern railroad will be extended to Madras, in Crook county, about 50 miles south of Shaniko, the present terminus.
