

Strawberry Culture.

Haising Chicory.

A light and moderately rich soil is recommended for chleory. The seed is sown in drills twelve inches apart and one inch deep. They are thinned to from six to nine inches and hoed frequently through the summer. In England it is found that chicory may be produced in winter in mushroom houses or in boxes under greenhouse benches where a temperature of 60 degrees can be had. In some localities in France caves or cellars are much used for forcing chicory .- American Cultivator.

Bush fruits may be set in the fall. Strawberries are planted in Septem-

Sow flower seeds now for winter bloom in windows or conservatory. Wet lands are not fit for orchards, and especially if set to fruit trees it

should not be done in the fall. Hard wooded cuttings of deutzia may be taken in the fall and treated in the same manner as currant cuttings.

As there is usually fine weather after the first frosts many plants and flowers may be kept presentable for such weather by protecting them on nights when the cold is likely to nip
