

SUBMARINE REEFS.

How They Are Located by the Navat Engineers.

Prior to the nineteenth century navi gation, except on the high seas, was mainly that of the Irish pilot who claimed to know all the rocks in the harbor, "An' there's wan of thim!" said he as he struck.

On approaching land one needs to know how far he is from the lighthouse or headland in sight. Triangulation tells him. Two points on land being taken for the base of the triangle, lines from these points, representing the other two sides of the triangle, are drawn until they latersect. That apex of the triangle will be the point where the observer is. Then the distance from his point to the land can be easily calculated.

The maritime wars under Napoleon disclosed the dangerous ignorance of Prench mariners about their own seacoast. French vessels were unable to break or run their enemies' blockade. After peace was established Beautemps Beaupre was appointed as the organizer and chief of corps of englneers to chart the whole coast of France. 
