Another Redistricting Process.
A proposition is on foot to redistrict the state and reapportion representation in the state legislature.
The counties of Eastern Oregon have never had equal rights in the legislature, and since the redistricting process of 1899, when Wasco county was made a part of the district comprising Lewis, Crook and Klamath counties, the county has but one representative in the legislature and no senator. At that time we had a senator and a representative. The purpose for which Wasco was attached having been accomplished, Wasco was taken off and Grant put on, which still left this county without possibilities of getting a senator. The move proposed now takes away Grant and attaches Wheeler.

Court Adjourns.
Circuit court adjourned last Friday evening, after hearing the evidence in the land cases, which was mostly documentary evidence. However, two witnesses offered new evidence, Geo. Wise and Charley Lohrengel, swore that they had never signed certain affidavits which bore their names. These affidavits were made by the corporation people in their proof of reclamation of the land involved. The Judge took the cases under advisement to be decided in vacation.
