LAKEVIEW, OREGON, NOV 15, 1906.

Secretary Hitchcock, of the Interior Department, has sent his resignation to the president, which was accepted, and the president announced that James R. Garfield, of Ohio, now commissioner of Corporations, would be appointed to succeed Hitchcock on March 4th, when the Hitchcock resignation is to take effect. It is also announced that Commissioner Richards of the General Land Office, will retire on March 4th. There has been a cry for Mr. Hitchcock's resignation for two years past, and this bit of news will be welcomed by those who made the cry.

The Examiner received the first news of the result of the election in a special last Thursday night, too late for publication in last week's issue. The contents of the message was posted up in several places for the benefit of those who were anxious for the news. The first telegrams received by other parties in Lakeview were not correct, and the one received by The Examiner was a surprise to some and a disappointment.

We may expect to hear of some high water about Portland.
