Has Become Prominent.

Herbert Dunlap, a former Lake county man, sheriff, stockman, blacksmith, and a good fellow, has recently gained some notoriety over in Klamath county, where he elected a year or so ago to make his future home, by way of his shrewdness, a characteristic which gained for him his former prominence in this county, only differently applied. Mr. Dunlap, it seems, has been furnishing both the Klamath Falls butchershops with beef and managed to keep the matter of his monopoly of the beef trade a secret, even the proprietors of the shops buying from him not knowing that the other shop was buying its beef there. He receiving 7 cents per pound for his beef, while the butchers were charging 15 cents to its customers. Someone started a roar, and the matter finally got in the papers, and it was said that a meat trust existed at Klamath Falls. The word "trust" was probably applied to the situation because of the significance of the word, as it is the stepping stone to that all important, and much used word, "graft". However, applicable the term may have been, it will likely result in the establishment of another butcher shop in that town, which (in defense of the so-called trust) may have been done at any time by anybody. However, there is reasonable margin between 7 cents and 15 cents for good profit for the retailer, and our friend, Mr. Dunlap is yet in no danger of a material decline in prices of beef by the carcass, in order to bring steaks and the consumer together on rare terms.

Arthur Crawford's Body Found.

During a heavy snowstorm last winter, Arthur Crawford, a brother of Jack Crawford, of this city, was lost down near the Lava Beds below Tule Lake. He was herding sheep at that time, and it is supposed that in attempting to reach his camp became bewildered and died from exposure. Diligent search was made for him at the time and on subsequent occasions, but no trace of him was ever found. A few days ago J. C. Brenton, in the employ of Whitney Bros., was in that vicinity with a bunch of sheep and found the remains of a man which are supposed to be those of Arthur Crawford. They were found in a southeasterly direction from Dry Lake, and only about a mile from the place where Crawford's camp was located when he was lost. While identification is not yet positive, yet it is generally conceded by those acquainted with the facts in the case that the remains are those of Crawford. The clothing and footwear are the same as those worn by the missing man.—Klamath Falls Herald.

Well Equipped Line.

Chas. Lambert, the superintendent of the Klamath Falls-Lakeview stage line, went to Klamath Falls Sunday to look after the country's interest.

This is one of the best equipped lines in Southern Oregon as the horses are young and weigh from 1200 to 1400 pounds and all of their wagons are new having been built especially for this line. There are 22 head of horses being used between the Falls and Bly thus giving the stock time to rest and this is the secret of the good time they are now making over the muddy roads.—Bonanza Bulletin
