New Building

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LAKEVIEW, OREGON, JAN. 10, 1907

Mr. Williams, the civil engineer, and the surveying crew for the Orya Irrigation Co. came in from the West Side Sunday. Mr. Williams says the reservoir site selected is an ideal one and that there will be sufficient water to irrigate the entire north end of Goose Lake valley, also that the water can be conveyed by easy canal clear to the north end of the valley. His report on the project is similar to that of Mr. S. G. Bennett, who was here a year and a half ago in the interest of the U. S. Reclamation service, as regards the feasibility, the amount of water to be stored, etc.

Frank C. Baker, one of the best known printers in the state of Oregon and who organized the Typographical Union in Portland, and a politician of note, died in Portland on the 2d of January, after a short illness. Frank Baker was known throughout the state if not as a politician, as a printer. He held the state printing office for eight years, and accumulated quite a fortune there. He was chairman of the Republican State Central committee, and resigned that position about a year ago.

What is going to be done to induce the legislature at its coming session to reduce the burden of taxation to Lake County? Lake County is second in population and wealth of Oregon Counties, yet there are eleven counties that pay less state taxes.

**Court Proceedings.**

Lakeview, Ore. Jan. 2, 1907. Be it remembered that a session of the County Court, of Lake County, Oregon, for the transaction of County Business, was begun and held at the County Court House, in Lakeview, in said County, on Wednesday, the 2d day of January, 1907.

Present: Hon. B. Daly, Judge; H. R. Heryford, and C. W. Dent, Commissioners; Albet Dent, Sheriff; E. N. Jaquish, Clerk, when the following proceedings were had, to-wit: Salary claims examined, approved, and warrants ordered drawn on the General Fund in payment of the same.

In the matter of the Tax Levy for the year 1907: After a careful examination of the taxable property of Lake County, Oregon, as shown by the Assessment Roll for the year 1906, and of the probable amount of money necessary to pay the expenses of said County for the ensuing year, and for the pupos of purchasing matial for the construction of a Court House building for said Lake County, Oregon, and for such other purposes as is required by law:

It is hereby ordered by the County Court of Lake County, Oregon, that a Tax be levied on all taxable property in said county, as shown by the Assessment Roll for the year 1906, and that the Rate of Levy for the several purposes be and the same is hereby fixed as follows:

For County puposes, (3 1/2 mills)—.0035  
For County School purposes, (5 mills)—.0050  
For County Road purposes (1 mill)—.0010  
For purchasing material for Court House building, (6 1/2 mills)—.0065  
Total levy for County, School, Road, and for the purpose of purchasing material for Court House building, (16 mills)—.0160

And that the said Rate of Sixteen Mills be levied on each dollar of taxable property as shown by the Assessment Roll of 1906, and also on such property as may be assessed by the Sheriff of the said Lake County, Oregon, in conformity with law.

In the matter of County Physician: There having been no county paupers to care for during the several months past; it is hereby ordered that the custom of employing a County Physician be and the same is hereby abolished.

It is hereby ordered that the Lake County Telephone and Telegraph Company, The Moss Telephone and Telegraph Company, Bunting Telephone and Telegraph Company, Lakeview-Pine Creek Electric Company (Telephone and Telegraph) and Dent Telephone and Telephone Company, Corporations existing under the laws of the State of Oregon each are hereby granted the right to maintain and operate their respective lines and fixtures, for telephone purposes upon the public roads and highways of Lake County Oregon, where the same are now located, or may be hereafter designated by this Court, on said roads, for a period of twenty-five years, commencing at the date of the completion of the several telephone lines as already located but in no sense to apply to extensions, provided that each of the Telephone Corporations shall give to all of the officers of the County Court, for official use, service with reasonable dispatch, over their several lines free of charge.

In the matter of the selection of a Newspaper to publish the County Court proceedings for the ensuing year, there being no list filed except that of The Lake County Examiner: It is hereby ordered that the Lake County Examiner, be and it is hereby selected as the Newspaper to publish the said County Court proceedings as is required by law, for the year ending January 1st, 1908.

In the matter of drawing a Jury List for the year 1907; the Court examined the names which appear upon the Assessment Roll for the year of 1906 and drew therefrom a list of taxpayers, which shall constitute the Jury List for Lake County, Oregon, for the year 1907, and that the said

Jury List is hereby filed as such Jur' List.

1 Whereas the Court House is not ony inadequate to transact the business of Lake County, but so old that it is practically unsafe for further occupancy; it is therefore deemed necessary that a new building be constructed, and in order that the same may be done as economically as possible, and also that the expense of such building may be extended over a period of two years so as to lessen the burd-n of taxation upon the taxpayers of the County: It is hereby ordered that plans and specifications, suitable for a Court House building for Lake County, Oregon, be secured and that the amount of money necessary to pay for the material for constructing the same shall be levied at the January, 1907, term of the County Court; that all of said material shall be purchased for the lowest and best prices obtainable for cash and that the said material shall be delivered on the Court House grounds during the Summer of 1907; that the amount of money necessary to complete said building shall be levied at the January, 1908 term of the County Court so that the said Court House building shall be completed during the Summer of 1908.

In the matter of the petition of J. L. Cliff, John C. Green and others, for the opening of road in Road District No. 1, the same having been thoroughly examined it has been found defective in almost every requirement of the law governing the opening of public roads, the Court therefore, having no jurisdiction in the matter, the petition is dismissed.

The Court in a former petition from the same petitioners, went to some pains to point out the mandatory requirements of the law, each one of which would have to be complied with, before the County Court would have jurisdiction in the matter. In the present petition, none of these requirements have been complied with. The Court would again suggest, that all petitions for roads should be first submitted to or prepared by some competent lawyer who understands the law relating to the subject of County Roads.

It is hereby ordered that the following be and they are, hereby appointed Road Supervisors for Lake County, Oregon, to-wit:

- " " 9, Drews Valley, W. D. Tracy.
- " " 10, Goose Lake, Ed. Tatro.
- " " 11, Cogswell Creek, T. B. Vernon.

Ordered that a license to sell spirituous, malt and vinous liquors in less quantities than one gallon, is hereby granted to William Wyatt, at Plush, Lake County, Oregon, for the period of one year from January 3, 1907, to January 3, 1908, both dates inclusive, the said William Wyatt, having complied with all the requirements of the law in the premises.
